

**Hunter 33-5 SD** – Passing Wind – (see attached) This boat was originally rated by us, but it was rated incorrectly. We rated the boat as a Hunter 33 (older boat) and the boat is a newer (2005) version which is significantly different. We to vote on a base rating.

- Base ratings new version
  - NE – 147 for Deep keel (no shoal draft rated)
  - LIS – 153
  - Ches – 141

**Suggested Base Rating of 153 plus adjustments** +6 for solid 3 blade prop, +6 for Mast RF, +3 for Jib RF. He did not include LP so at this point we must assume 155% with no credit. = 168

**Suggested base rating of 144 plus adjustments** +3 for RF – Has main sail RF but has battens, per bylaws, there is no credit with battens.

**Chesapeake 30**

- This is a complicated one. There were apparently both C30 short mast and tall mast versions built. This one applying for a rating is a tall mast version. The only C30 in the PHRF book is in the Ches region @ 174 and that is a short rig. It appears that the Chesapeake 30 and the Siedelmann 30 (not the Siedelmann 30T) are similar boats. Here are the differences.
  - Standard C30 has a disp of 11,500, standard S30 has a displ of 9400
- The S30 rates 168 is the Ches, 162 in NE and apparently a long time ago, we had one in PHRF-MA at 159
- The boat applying is a standard Tall Mast C30.

**Suggested base rating of C30 TM of 168 plus adjustments** (9 seconds slower than the PHRF-MA rated S30 as a result of the additional displacement) +3 for RF. No adjustment for Asm spin, smaller than standard and on pole < J dimensions.
